



TEMARIO:

1. The noun phrase: nouns, determiners and pronouns.
2. Adjectives: syntactic functions; semantic classification of adjectives; comparatives and superlative degree; formation of adjectives; adjectives in combination; adjective complementation.
3. The verb phrase: syntax and semantics; tense aspect and mood.
4. Adverbs and the adverbial phrase: morphology; structure of adverbial phrases; syntactic roles; semantic meanings.
5. Prepositions and prepositional phrases: simple and complex prepositions; types of prepositions; complementation of verbs and adjectives.
6. The simple sentence: syntactic functions and order of clause elements; semantic roles; subject verb concord; negation.
7. Clause types and discourse functions: interrogative clauses; imperative clauses; exclamative clauses; noun sentences.
8. Coordinate sentences: coordinators; subordinators and discourse markers; types of coordination.
9. The complex sentence: finite, non-finite and verb-less clauses; formal indicators of coordination; the verb phrase in subordinate clauses; reporting the language of others; syntax and semantics of the subordinate clauses.
10. Textual features: the structure of information; cohesion and coherence; cohesive devices.
11. The English phonemes. Definition, identification and production.
12. Basic pronunciation rules in English.
13. Stress and Rhythm in English: stress in the word and in the sentence; weak forms, tonicity.
14. Basic intonation patterns in English.
15. The Pragmatic and functional perspective: language functions and speech acts; communicative purpose.
16. Text in context: Types of context; context variables; the concept of genre.
17. The components of communicative ability: linguistic competence; communicative competence and communicative language ability.
18. The four language skills: intensive and extensive practice; the bottom-up and top-down perspectives; features of oral discourse, sub-skills and strategies for reading; writing; listening and speaking; types of activities.
19. Aprendizaje y adquisición del inglés como lengua extranjera: factores externos e internos y diferencias individuales en la adquisición del inglés como lengua extranjera; enfoques y métodos de instrucción formal.

DESCRIPCIÓN DE LA PRUEBA:
